



## Burgundy 2024 Vintage Report

The 2024 vintage was marked by highly unpredictable weather throughout the growing season, presenting considerable challenges for growers. Yields are significantly down, yet the overall quality of the wines is remarkable. Whites stand out for their precision and freshness, while the reds exhibit wonderful purity and definition.

Budburst came early at the beginning of April. Cool temperatures in lower-lying areas affected early bud development, but frost damage was limited. The main challenge was the rain, which fell in bucketloads. March ranked among the wettest months in fifty years, according to the CIVB. April brought a brief respite, only for May and June to deliver heavy rainfall and thunderstorms. Unsettled conditions during flowering in mid-June led to significant coulure, resulting in a substantial loss of yield.

Persistent rainfall necessitated repeated treatments against mildew, which appeared unusually early. Lower-lying areas with poorly drained soils were most vulnerable. The first spots emerged on leaves in early May, then spread to flowers and grape clusters. Unsettled weather throughout spring and summer maintained constant pressure.

Speed was essential, yet sodden ground often made it impossible to take tractors into the vineyards. Heavy rain repeatedly washed away organic treatments, forcing growers to monitor forecasts constantly and work around the clock. For organic and biodynamic producers, the season demanded extraordinary effort, with up to twenty treatments required, double the usual number. The situation raised questions about the viability of organic viticulture, but none of our growers wavered, choosing to persevere.

August brought a more optimistic outlook, with veraison occurring mid-month. Vine development accelerated, and vineyard health recovered as warmer, drier conditions set in. A two-week spell of fine weather in mid-September was particularly beneficial, allowing the remaining fruit to ripen gradually and evenly while building sugars and flavour. Most growers began picking around 15th–16th September, concluding by the 22nd. Jacques Carillon reported cool mornings and pleasant afternoon temperatures, ideal for harvesting without rushing. A northerly wind helped dry and concentrate the berries, yielding a surprisingly healthy, though limited, crop.

Yields were down across the Côte d'Or, with reds suffering more than whites. Chardonnay, being more resilient than Pinot Noir, fared better against mildew. Poor flowering compounded the problem, especially for Pinot Noir in the Côte de Nuits. Older

vines suffered more from coulure than younger ones. As a result, growers lost between 25% and 40% of their whites, and up to 80% of their reds, with organic producers hit hardest. Yields were “historically low” at Domaine AF Gros, marking “the smallest harvest ever recorded.” Sylvie Esmonin hoped she would never see such a small vintage again in her lifetime.

Despite the modest crop, sorting tables were widely deployed (a previous generation would have thrown everything in). In the cellar, growers did not shy away from whole-bunch fermentation either, as healthy stems could add complexity to reds, though most appear to have used them more sparingly. Others, such as Sébastien Magnien, opted against whole bunch entirely, noting there was already enough freshness. By and large, extractions were as gentle as possible, with winemakers favouring delicate pump-overs or what they called “infusion.” New oak was generally kept to a minimum to let the pure fruit of the vintage shine through. It was certainly a bad year for tonnelleries.

A cooler, more classic Burgundy style has taken shape. Growers draw comparisons with the 2014 vintage, particularly for the whites, which stand out for their freshness. Jacques Carillon describes the whites as “bright, precise and elegant,” while Henri Boillot says they are “tendre and précis.” Energy and purity shine through all the whites at Domaine Paul Pillot. The 2024 reds are fragrant and delicious with moderate alcohol or “très Pinot,” as Thierry Amiot puts it. Despite heavy losses, Esmonin produced harmonious and well-defined reds with a “concentration naturelle” resulting from the low yields. Overall, the reds show balance and finesse, and a clear sense of terroir.

In summary, a year that will be remembered for its chaotic weather and challenging conditions, 2024 has nonetheless produced some truly exciting wines. Quantities are drastically down in some areas, but it is a vintage “to go for” in our opinion.

## Domaine Guy Amiot et Fils, Chassagne-Montrachet

Arsène Amiot began acquiring vineyards in Chassagne-Montrachet during the 1920s, securing parcels in Caillerets and even a few rows of Le Montrachet. A decade later came Les Macherelles, followed by Puligny-Montrachet Les Demoiselles. By the time Thierry succeeded his father, Guy Amiot, in 1993, the family had assembled an enviable collection of holdings. Whites are defined by layered citrus and stone fruit, the reds are supple and elegant. The 2024 vintage was down by 50%. Thierry described it as “a classic vintage for whites that truly express their terroirs.” The reds, too, have turned out to be remarkably attractive.

2024 Chassagne-Montrachet Vieilles Vignes  
£295.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

The Chassagne-Montrachet comes from 60-year-old vines spread across a dozen or so plots. On the nose, sweet lemon and stone-fruit aromas lead to an appealing palate with hints of white peach and pear. Attractive drinking from release. Drink from 2026.

2024 Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Macherelles  
£340.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Amiot owns a single 0.5-hectare plot of Les Macherelles. Adjacent to Chenevottes and Vergers, the vineyard runs right up to the houses at the northern edge of the village. Old vines, shallow soils, and cooler temperatures give the wines notable energy. The 2024 has a fresh citrus bouquet lifted by scents of summer flowers, while the palate reveals white pear and orchard fruit underscored by a delicate saline minerality. We recommend cellaring for a few years. Drink from 2028.

2024 Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Caillerets  
£425.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Caillerets is among the domaine’s oldest plots, lying adjacent to the family property on the southern edge of the village. Stony soils and 80-year-old vines at the top of the slope impart energy and freshness. The 2024 shows wonderful definition and drive, with bright citrus aromas leading to a multi-layered palate of lively lemon fruit and a saline mineral finish. Excellent ageing potential. Drink from 2028.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Demoiselles  
£545.00 per 3 bottle case in bond

Adjacent to Le Montrachet, Les Demoiselles is an enclave within Les Caillerets. Its name recalls the sisters who once owned the plot. Showing superb delineation, the 2024 has a vibrant bouquet with delicate white-truffle nuances. Silky stone-fruit flavours are balanced by mouthwatering citrus notes. Refined and energetic. Drink from 2029.

2024 Le Montrachet Grand Cru  
£2200.00 per 3 bottle case in bond

Comprising two micro-plots planted in 1923 on the Chassagne side and totalling two ouvrées (0.83 ha), this steep site has never been worked by tractor. Old vines, perfect south-facing exposure, and stony soils yield tiny, concentrated berries. The 2024 is complex and elegant on the nose, while the palate is beautifully balanced with intense yellow-fruit flavours and a refreshing lime and oyster-shell note. Matured in 100% new oak. Drink from 2033.

2024 Beaune Longbois  
£160.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Longbois lies to the west of Beaune at the top of the hill. A parcel of 80-year-old vines surrounded by woods, the 2024 is an appealing and aromatic wine with scented redcurrant flavours and fine mineral tannins. Delicious from release. Drink from 2026.

2024 Chassagne-Montrachet Rouge Vieilles Vignes  
£160.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

The Chassagne-Montrachet Rouge Vieilles Vignes, from vines over 50 years old, displays a bright nose of raspberry and forest fruits with subtle briary hedgerow notes. The palate is lively and fresh, offering crushed raspberry and strawberry flavours with a hint of blueberry. The 2024 will be delightful from release. Drink from 2026.



## Domaine Berthelemot, Meursault

Domaine Berthelemot is a family-run estate founded by Brigitte Berthelemot in 2006. The domaine spans 15 hectares across the Côte de Beaune with vineyards in Meursault, Puligny-Montrachet, Pommard and Beaune. Deeply committed to the environment, they achieved organic certification in 2021. Brigitte's son, Thomas, who now runs the domaine, is steadily moving towards biodynamic practices to capture, in his words, "the essence of each terroir." The 2024 harvest took place between September 12th and 22nd under sunny skies which dried the berries and helped complete ripening. Grapes were meticulously sorted in the vineyard and at the cellar to ensure only the healthiest fruit made it into each cuvée. This year, the reds were 100% destemmed and pressed as gently as possible. Overall, they lost 50% of their whites and 80% of their reds. Despite the many challenges, the wines display magnificent tension and purity.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet  
£252.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

A blend of two sites planted in the 1960s - Les Rechaux, with deep clay and alluvial soils, and Les Meix, with clay and limestone - this cuvée opens with fragrant lemon and lime aromas. The palate is energetic and citrus-driven, accented by a hint of spice and a racy mineral finish. Shows excellent definition and focus. Drink from 2026.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet Les Levrons  
£260.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Situated below Referts, vines planted in 1947 and deep limestone and marl soils lend a distinctive mineral edge. The nose reveals fresh apple and lemon aromas, while the palate combines stone fruit and crisp apple notes underscored by a lively mineral edge. It could be enjoyed young but has the persistence for longer ageing. Drink from 2027.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Folatières  
£380.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Folatières offers a complex and powerful nose combining white flowers, lime and fresh almonds. The palate is silky in texture, with cool citrus and pithy lemon fruit at the core, finishing on an attractive mineral bitterness. Showing focus and precision, it will be approachable in a few years with the potential to age for much longer. Drink from 2028.

2024 Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Abbaye de Morgeot  
£330.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From vineyards that once belonged to the Morgeot abbey founded by the Cistercians, Chassagne-Montrachet Morgeot offers enticing aromas of honeysuckle, lemon peel and dried citrus. The palate reveals delicate stone-fruit flavours balanced by an energetic mineral edge. It could be enjoyed young but will age for ten years. Drink from 2028.

2024 Beaune 1er Cru Les Grèves  
£188.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

A terroir renowned for finesse, Beaune Grèves offers a scented bouquet of strawberries and wild berries. The palate shows lovely focus and depth, with subtle redcurrant and hedgerow fruit, delicate tannins and a fine mineral finish. It could be enjoyed young but will have a long drinking window. Drink from 2027.

2024 Pommard 1er Cru Les Arvelets  
£268.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

The Pommard Les Arvelets 1er Cru opens with a vibrant bouquet of red and black fruits, layered with crushed rock and subtle hedgerow notes. On the palate, it displays superb precision with pure red fruit, lifted by a fine thread of acidity and refreshing tannins. Exceptionally elegant and poised to age gracefully for ten years. Drink from 2027.



## Domaine Bitouzet-Prieur, Volnay & Meursault

Domaine Bitouzet-Prieur was created when Vincent Bitouzet from Volnay married Ann Prieur from Meursault. François Bitouzet took over in 2012 moving to an impressive new cuverie outside Meursault in 2019. The holdings, 60% of which are Pinot Noir and 40% Chardonnay, include a selection of the finest Premier Crus in Volnay and Meursault. Committed to sustainability, the domaine stopped using herbicides in 1995 and has been certified organic since the 2023 vintage. François intervenes as little as possible in the cellar using native yeasts and a traditional press. Filtering and bottling are by gravity-flow. The 2024 vintage began with Pinot Noir on 12th September followed by Chardonnay from the 16th. Rigorous sorting eliminated berries affected by mildew, and all bunches were 100% destemmed, with no new oak. The whites are aromatic and vibrant, while the reds are supple and pure, “an explosion of fresh red fruit” says François.

2024 Meursault Clos du Cromin  
£342.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

A vineyard enclosed by a stone wall, northeast of the village, the 2024 has a floral bouquet with scents of freshly cut apples and almonds. Rounded stone-fruit flavours are balanced by a zippy citrus character. Enjoy from release. Drink from 2026.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet Les Levrans  
£450.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Neighbouring Referts, old vines bring an added mineral intensity to this wine. The 2024 has a lifted citrus bouquet with delicate spice notes. Mouthwatering apple and stone fruit flavours lead to a refreshing mineral finish. Great persistence. Drink from 2027.

2024 Meursault 1er Cru Les Perrières  
£720.00 per 6 bottles in bond

From a single parcel in Perrières-Dessus planted in 1983, Les Perrières offers a brighter profile than Charmes, with lifted green citrus aromas. Intense lemon and white apple flavours are underscored by mouthwatering mineral freshness. Showing impressive depth and persistence, it will reward several years of cellaring. Drink from 2028.

2024 Volnay 1er Cru Pitures  
£384.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

North of the village near Pommard, Pitures is a steep, elevated site that produces wines of striking purity. The 2024 opens with a bouquet of cassis and crushed raspberry. Dark forest fruit flavours mingle with lively strawberry and rose petal scents, supported by fine, well-integrated tannins. A wine with real personality and charm. Drink from 2028.

2024 Volnay 1er Cru Taillepieds  
£435.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

South of Volnay, adjacent to Clos des Chênes, Taillepieds sits on rocky topsoil that imparts notable tension and precision. The 2024 is beautifully balanced and well-defined, opening with a bright bouquet of raspberries, cherries and cranberries. On the palate, delicate plum and sweet damson fruit are supported by fine, integrated tannins. Showing superb energy, it promises excellent ageing potential. Drink from 2028.

2024 Volnay 1er Cru Clos des Chênes  
£465.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Halfway up the slope above Caillerets towards Monthélie, the impressive 2024 Clos des Chênes reveals a majestic bouquet of blackcurrant and sweet red apple, lifted by a subtle touch of spice. The palate is deep and complex, framed by beautifully refined tannins. A wine built for long ageing. Drink from 2028.

2024 Volnay 1er Caillerets  
£648.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Below Clos des Chênes, on a gentle east-facing slope with reddish-brown clay over limestone, Caillerets delivers an energetic bouquet of redcurrant and sweet plum. The palate is charming and elegant, with aromatic red-fruit flavours supported by a refreshing mineral note. It will develop greater complexity with age. Drink from 2028.



## Domaine Henri Boillot, Meursault

Domaine Henri Boillot spans 15 hectares, with white vineyards primarily in Puligny-Montrachet and Meursault, and reds in Savigny-lès-Beaune, Beaune and Volnay. The superb quality and precision of these wines reflect Henri Boillot's energy and mastery as a vigneron. Highly meticulous, he follows biodynamic methods, keeps all the leaves on the vines and picks early to retain freshness. In the cellar, incoming fruit is carefully protected against oxidation using CO<sup>2</sup>. White grapes undergo whole-bunch pressing, followed by cold maceration and fermentation in 350-litre barrels. Boillot pioneered 'vinification integral' a technique where whole berries go directly into barrels which are rotated several times daily to achieve a gentle extraction of colour and flavour. Harvesting started 14th September for the 2024 vintage. Henri Boillot describes it as a "grand millésime" for whites, comparing them to the 2014 vintage for their freshness, while highlighting their elegance. Whites are both "tendre and précis".

2024 Bourgogne Chardonnay  
£180.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From parcels in Meursault, Puligny-Montrachet, Saint Romain, Auxey-Duresses and Monthélie, the 2024 has an intense mineral nose with hints of white smoke. Vibrant stone-fruit flavours mingle with energetic citrus notes finishing on a refreshing mineral edge. No new wood. Beautifully balanced and perfect from release. Drink from 2026.

2024 Meursault  
£435.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

The Meursault is a blend of well-placed parcels across the village. Showing wonderful freshness and persistence, it opens with a pure bouquet of stone fruits and white flowers. Intense citrus flavours and a mouthwatering grapefruit note are underscored by a salty mineral edge on the palate. It could be aged for a few years. Drink from 2026.

2024 Meursault 1er Cru Clos Richemont Monopole  
£772.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Purchased a few years ago, this impressive monopole vineyard delivers a complex bouquet of white pear, floral notes and a hint of white mushroom. Silky-textured stone-fruit flavours are balanced by a zesty citrus edge. Showing lovely intensity and persistence, the 2024 will be delicious after a few years in bottle. Drink from 2028.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Clos de la Mouchère  
£855.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

An enclosure within Les Perrières, 'Mouche' being an old Burgundian word for 'bee', Mouchère is wholly owned by the domaine. Eighty-year-old vines lend remarkable complexity. The bouquet is multi-layered, revealing pear, honeysuckle and grapefruit. Silky white-fruit flavours are supported by an energetic mineral freshness. "Un Petit Bâtard". Drink from 2028.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Pucelles  
£855.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Les Pucelles is an exceptional site with old vines, lying adjacent to Bâtard-Montrachet and Bienvenues-Bâtard. Millerandage concentrates the berries. Classy and elegant, the 2024 has an ethereal bouquet of white pear and fresh almond. Crystalline citrus flavours mingle with delicate spices and a mouthwatering mineral note. Magnificent. Drink from 2029.



## Domaine Henri Boillot, Meursault

2024 Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru  
£765.00 per 3 bottle case in bond

The complex Corton-Charlemagne reveals an expansive bouquet of almond and stone fruit. The palate is enveloping, with mouthwatering mineral notes, white citrus and hints of lime and green ginger. Offering magnificent complexity and superb textural depth, this wine promises exceptional ageing potential. Drink from 2032.

2024 Bâtard-Montrachet Grand Cru

2024 Montrachet Grand Cru  
£1300.00 per 1 bottle case

2024 Volnay 1er Cru Les Fremiets  
£475.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Bordering Pommard and below Clos des Ducs, Fremiets faces the morning sun. A delicate and energetic wine, the 2024 opens with sweet forest-fruit aromas interwoven with rose-petal scents. On the palate, crushed strawberry flavours are supported by fine mineral tannins, giving structure and finesse. Drink from 2027.

2024 Volnay 1er Cru Les Caillerets  
£645.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

A beautifully balanced Caillerets with an alluring bouquet of swirling red berries. Sweet red fruit is harmoniously framed by silky tannins, while an energetic freshness lends a weightless quality. Supple, elegant, and built for long-term drinking. Drink from 2028.



## Domaine Jacques Carillon, Puligny-Montrachet

The Carillon family has been making wine in Puligny-Montrachet since the 16th century, beginning with Jehan Carillon in 1520. Jacques Carillon joined his father in 1980, and in 2010, Jacques and his wife Sylvia founded Domaine Jacques Carillon, with 5.25 hectares of vines primarily in Puligny-Montrachet. Avoiding herbicides and pesticides, all vineyard work is done by hand. In the cellar, a restrained use of oak, with only 15-20% new barrels, keeps the wines fresh and pure. In 2024, Jacques lost 50% of his village wines and saw a 15% reduction in his Premier Crus. Harvest began on 14th September under cool, bright conditions, ideal for picking. The resulting wines are precise and elegant, “a classic style that we made in the past,” as Jacques describes them.

2024 Saint-Aubin 1er Cru Les Pitangerets  
£265.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

A new addition to the range, from relatively young vines, the Pitangerets offers a vibrant, mineral driven nose, while the palate delivers crisp lemon and lime notes, finishing with a smoky mineral edge. Beautifully crafted and full of energy. Drink from 2026

2024 Chassagne-Montrachet  
£265.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From a single ¼ hectare plot planted in 2013, just south of the village, the 2024 has a bright citrus bouquet with notes of yellow fruit and touch of grapefruit on the palate. It has great concentration and energy for relatively young vines. Drink from 2026.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet  
£295.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From seven plots scattered across Puligny-Montrachet, the 2024 opens with refreshing scents of apple and white citrus. Well-balanced and nicely concentrated, it offers sweet lemon flavours that lead to a mouthwatering finish. Drink from 2026.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Champs Canet  
£545.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From vines planted in 1973, Les Champs Canet lies at the northern end of the appellation near Meursault, where crumbly limestone bedrock is topped with stony marl. The 2024 opens with an enticing bouquet of grapefruit and a hint of white

smoke. Persistent green citrus flavours combine with refreshing acidity and impressive length. Absolutely delicious. Drink from 2028.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Perrières  
£545.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

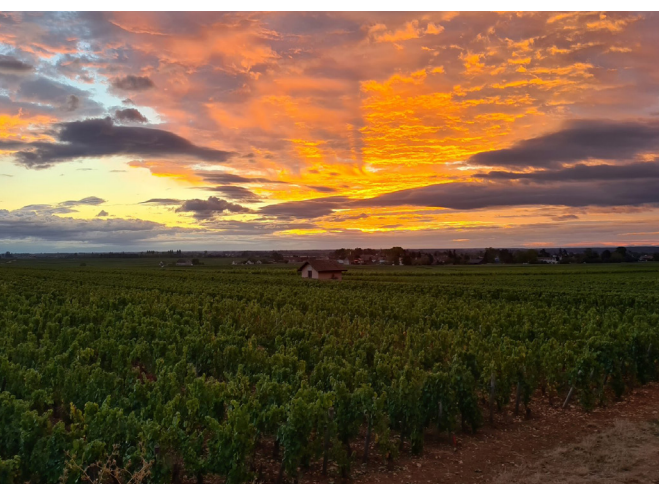
South of Referts on the slope, the soils here are a classic mix of marl and limestone-clay. The 2024 opens with a smoky grapefruit bouquet accented by notes of lemon pith. Concentrated sweet citrus flavours are underpinned by a mouthwatering mineral edge. Superb. Drink from 2028.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Referts  
£545.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Bordering Meursault, Referts offers an extra layer of complexity. Its shallow soils lend a refreshing mineral edge. The 2024 vintage presents a pure bouquet with subtle smoky nuances and a concentrated palate with a core of yellow fruit. A persistent mineral thread balances the richness, delivering impressive length. Drink from 2029.

2024 Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet  
£340 per 1 bottle case in bond

The Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet reveals a tightly wound bouquet of bright citrus fruit with scents of honeysuckle, apple blossom and almonds. The palate is a touch restrained at present, yet vibrant stone fruit and grapefruit notes emerge, leading to a crisp, refreshing finish. Great potential here. Cellar for ten years. Drink from 2034.



## Edouard Delaunay, Nuits-Saint-Georges

Founded in 1893, Delaunay is once again under the stewardship of fifth-generation Laurent Delaunay. The original négociant house, created by his great-great-grandfather Edouard, was among Burgundy's most prestigious names and served as distributor for Domaine de la Romanée-Conti, holding exclusivity for La Romanée until the 1940s. In 2018, Laurent repurchased the business from Jean-Claude Boisset, including the historic cellars beside the family home, Château de Charmont, in the Hautes-Côtes de Beaune. Today, with access to some of the finest vineyards in the Côte d'Or, Laurent and his wife Catherine craft an exceptional range of wines. The 2024s stand out for their freshness, purity and elegance, though with only a few barrels of each cuvée at most, availability is extremely limited.

2024 Puligny-Montrachet Le Village  
£400.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Sourced mainly from 'Corvée des Vignes', near Meursault Premier Cru Charmes, this elegant Puligny-Montrachet offers appealing stone-fruit aromas with hints of white peach on the palate supported by a refreshing chalky mineral note. Drink from 2026.

2024 Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru  
£1495.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From the south-facing 'En Charlemagne' vineyard on the Pernand-Vergelesses/Aloxe-Corton border, the Corton-Charlemagne opens with lifted aromas of white pear and fresh almonds. White apple and silky stone fruit flavours lead to a refreshing finish. The 2024 offers a broad drinking window but should be approachable in a few years. Matured in a single one-year-old barrel. Drink from 2028.

2024 Nuits-Saint-Georges Le Village Vieilles Vignes  
£250.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

A benchmark cuvée, the Nuits-Saint-Georges comes from two parcels north of the village, 'Aux Allots' and 'Aux Athées.' The 2024 has a lifted bouquet of fresh red berries with a subtle mineral note. Bright redcurrant flavours flow across the palate, supported by fine mineral tannins. Fully destemmed. Only two barrels made. Drink from 2027.

2024 Pommard 1er Cru Les Chaponnières  
£370.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Les Chaponnières lies at the southern edge of Pommard, just below Rugiens-Bas. Deep soils and 80-year-old vines impart remarkable complexity to this distinguished cuvée. Elegantly concentrated, the 2024 opens with a bright bouquet of redcurrant and subtle hedgerow fruits. Smooth tannins frame sweet plum flavours, promising excellent ageing potential. Drink from 2028.

2024 Chambolle-Musigny Le Village Vieilles Vignes  
£440.00 per 6 bottle case in bond.

The 2024 Chambolle-Musigny Village displays a charming bouquet of perfumed redcurrant and raspberry aromas. The medium-bodied palate is supple, with vibrant red fruit flavours and fine mineral tannins that lend precision and length. Drink from 2027.

2024 Clos-de-Vougeot Grand Cru  
£1260.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Sourced from Les Petits Maupertuis, close to Echezeaux, and Les Dix Journaux, between Clos Vougeot and Château de Latour, the 2024 offers a seductive nose of dark berries and wildflowers. The palate delivers sleek blackcurrant fruit supported by structured, harmonious tannins. It will develop further complexity over the next decade. Ageing in a single one year old barrel. Drink from 2029.

2024 Charmes-Chambertin Grand Cru  
£1360.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From two distinct plots, Charmes (shallow soils) and Mazoyères (chalk and clay), the 2024 has a perfumed bouquet of wild strawberries and dark forest fruits. The palate is layered and complex, combining delicate cassis and blueberry fruit notes with beautifully refined tannins. Shows superb energy and definition. Drink from 2029.

## Domaine Sylvie Esmonin, Gevrey-Chambertin

Domaine Sylvie Esmonin is located at the foot of Gevrey-Chambertin's Clos Saint-Jacques. Sylvie has cultivated seven hectares under her own name since 1988. The domaine is organic but she follows biodynamic principles. Grapes are de-stemmed, crushed and fermented in open wooden vats. Barrels of various ages accommodate different cuvées with a higher proportion of new oak for Clos Saint-Jacques. She uses gravity pumping and bottles without fining or filtration. 2024 is the smallest vintage Sylvie can remember, 80% down on the previous vintage. She described long days, countless hours in the vineyards and rigorous sorting but the results are magnificent. The wines have a "concentration naturelle" says Sylvie due to the low yields. She describes 2024 as "un millésime Bourgogne avec une forte identité de terroir."

2024 Bourgogne Rouge  
£145.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Sourced from five parcels in Gevrey-Chambertin, 'Cuvée Sylvie' opens with an expressive bouquet of strawberries and vibrant red berries. The palate reveals sweet cassis and delicate dried fruit notes, harmoniously balanced by fine, integrated tannins. Enjoy upon release. Drink from 2026.

2024 Côte de Nuits Villages  
£200.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From Croix Violette and Vignois in Brochon, parcels soon to be promoted to Fixin, the 2024 contains 30% whole bunch. Opening with an enticing bouquet of sweet, wild berries, the palate is full of blackcurrant and plum fruit with a seasoning of cracked black pepper. Showing impressive depth and energy, this is delicious. Drink from 2027.

2024 Gevrey-Chambertin

The 2024 Gevrey-Chambertin, also with 30% whole bunch, has an attractive pure cassis and strawberry bouquet. Delicate red berry flavours mingle with crushed redcurrant and cranberry notes. Fine, delineated tannins frame the finish. Drink from 2028.

2024 Gevrey-Chambertin Vieilles Vignes  
£330.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

The Vieilles Vignes comes from 80-year-old vines and a selection of the best parcels. Harmonious and intense, the 2024 has an expansive dark strawberry and plum bouquet. The palate delivers concentrated blackcurrant flavours with a hint of sweet bramble, all balanced by silky tannins. Shows great ageing potential. 50% whole bunch. Drink from 2028.

2024 Volnay 1er Cru Santenots  
£415.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

South of Volnay, Santenots reds (whites fall under the Meursault appellation) are rich and structured and age well. Sylvie's Santenots are from some of her oldest vines. Supple and elegant with ripe red fruit and well-integrated tannins, the limestone terroir comes through on the mineral finish. Only a few barrels. Drink from 2028.

2024 Gevrey-Chambertin 1er Cru Clos Saint Jacques  
£830.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Saint Jacques stands alone from the Grand Crus of Gevrey-Chambertin which explains why it was excluded from the Grand Cru classification in the 1930s. The vines date back to 1925. This beautifully complex cuvée offers a multi-layered bouquet with delicate blueberry and violet notes. The palate shows wonderful balance, with crunchy raspberry and cassis flavours supported by silky-textured tannins. Includes 50% whole bunch. Drink from 2032.



## Domaine Faiveley, Nuits-Saint-Georges

Faiveley covers 120 hectares in some of the most sought-after vineyards in Burgundy, including 12 hectares of Grands Cru vines. Founded in 1825 by Joseph Faiveley, Erwan Faiveley is the seventh generation in charge. Erwan believes that quality comes from the vineyards, so treatments are minimised and yields are kept low. Modern barrel presses, custom wooden vats and long ageing produce deeply flavoured reds and elegant whites. 2024 is the third year they have followed organic practices across the entire domaine. Harvest began 11th September in Givry, continued from 16th September in the Côte d'Or, and concluded on 24th September in Marsannay and Gevrey Village. At the winery, meticulous sorting removed any berries affected by mildew. The resulting wines show exceptional finesse: reds are “delicate and elegant” yet remarkably concentrated, while whites offer impressive freshness and persistence.

2024 Corton Clos des Cortons Faiveley Grand Cru  
£1170.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

A monopole of the Faiveley family since 1874, this is one of just two Grands Crus in Burgundy that bear the name of their owners, Romanée-Conti being the other. Concentrated and tightly wound at this stage, the 2024 reveals a bouquet of black cherries, plum and baking spices. A broad tannic frame points to a long future, while forest fruits and peppery spice add complexity on the palate. Drink from 2030.

2024 Clos de Vougeot Grand Cru  
£1355.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Faiveley owns three parcels of Clos de Vougeot, two in the lower part and one in the middle near the château. The 2024 shows an elegant bouquet of red cherries, raspberries and orange zest, with a touch of wood smoke. The palate is svelte, shaped by fresh acidity, offering supple tannins and lifted forest fruit notes. Poised and refined, with charm and clarity. Superb potential. Drink from 2030.



## Domaine Gagnard-Delagrangre, Chassagne-Montrachet

Domaine Gagnard-Delagrangre was founded in 1959 following the marriage of Jacques Gagnard and Marie-Josèphe Delagrangre. After Jacques' death in 2009, Marie-Josèphe took over the remaining three hectares. The wines are classic expressions of their terroirs. In the cellar, fermentation occurs spontaneously, and the wines are matured in barrel for 15–18 months, with around 15% new oak for the Premier Crus and slightly more for the Grand Cru. Harvest for the 2024 vintage took place between 13th and 18th September under cool, sunny conditions, ideal for picking. A careful triage in the vineyards and further sorting at the cellar ensured only the healthiest grapes were used. Madame Gagnard has passed some of her vineyards to other family members and is therefore offering only two cuvées from this vintage along with some 2023 Premier Crus.

2024 Chassagne-Montrachet

Exclusively from Maltroie, the Chassagne-Montrachet has a very attractive floral bouquet of summer fruits, honeysuckle and white flowers. On the palate, sweet stone fruit is balanced by a salty mineral edge and a zippy citrus quality. It shows excellent balance and freshness and remains one of the best-value wines in the appellation. Drink from 2026.

2024 Bourgogne Passetoutgrains  
£75.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From 60-year-old vines in Chassagne-Montrachet, the Passetoutgrains is 1/3 Pinot Noir and 2/3 Gamay, fermented together. The 2024 offers a delicate bouquet of wild strawberries and hedgerow fruits. Vibrant and delicious, the palate reveals crunchy raspberry and forest fruit flavours with a subtle hint of rose petal. No new oak is used. Enjoy on release or cellar for a few years, as Mme Gagnard does. Drink from 2026.



## Domaine Henri Gouges, Nuits-Saint-Georges

One of the most celebrated estates in Nuits-Saint-Georges, Henri Gouges has a history dating back to the 1920s when Henri himself began bottling wine at the domaine. Henri's grandsons, Pierre and Christian, carved out a reputation for sturdy and long-lived Burgundies. Gregory and Antoine Gouges are the latest generation to make their mark. They follow the family's motto that "great wines are made on the vines" but have made a few changes including softer pressings and a reduction in the use of new wood resulting in wines that are silkier and more refined than ever before. All the vines are cultivated organically. Harvest took place in the week of 15th September.

2024 Nuits-Saint-Georges  
£240.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

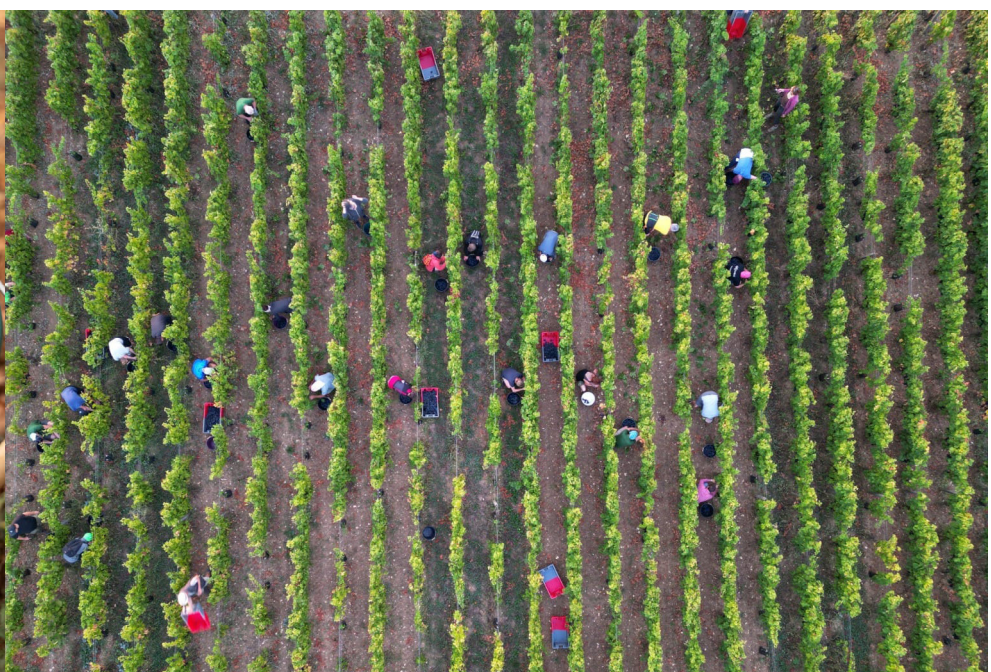
From six parcels to the south of Nuits-Saint-Georges, the 2024 is beautifully scented with fragrant purple flowers, ripe plum and morello cherry. The palate shows sweet cherry and bramble fruit flavours with fine-grained tannins. This has structure to age, but the purity of the fruit will make it hard to resist in a year or two. Drink from 2027.

2024 Nuits-Saint-Georges 1er Cru Clos des Porrets  
Saint Georges

Under Les Perrières, to the south of Nuits-Saint-Georges, Clos des Porrets is a monopole of the Gouges family. A warm vineyard, stony clay soils and limestone bedrock lend structure and density. The 2024 is a Gouges of yesteryear; brooding, rich and concentrated with a broad tannic structure that will benefit from cellaring. Dark forest fruits dominate the palate, with cocoa and peppery spice. Drink from 2030.

2024 Nuits-Saint-Georges 1er Cru Les Saint  
Georges  
£870.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Les Saint Georges is the historic heart of Nuits-Saint-Georges, a site so esteemed that it gave its name to the town in 1892 and is now under review for Grand Cru status. The Domaine farms a one-hectare parcel of massal-selected vines averaging 60 years of age, rooted in deep clay-rich soils with limestone scree. The 2024 is dark and serious, opening on blackberry, damson and bitter orange, with undertones of cocoa and savoury spice. The palate is firm, driven by depth, structure, and finely judged acidity. Classical and authoritative, this is a Saint-Georges built for the long term.



## Domaine A-F Gros, Pommard

Domaine A-F Gros was established by Anne-Françoise Gros who inherited vineyards in Savigny, Vosne-Romanée, Chambolle-Musigny, Echézeaux and Richebourg. Anne-Françoise's talented daughter and son, Caroline and Mathias, now run the property. Recent innovations in the vineyards include training vines into arches to increase the leaf surface area, thereby enhancing phenolic ripeness. In the cellar, most of the wines are now 50% matured in neutral ceramic vessels amplifying their purity and precision. Despite a challenging year and the smallest harvest ever recorded, the 2024s display remarkable balance and finesse. Healthy fruit allowed for a high proportion of whole clusters (around 30% for Bourgogne Pinot Noir, 50-75% for the top cuvées) bringing freshness and energy. No fruit was purchased in 2024; every grape came from the domaine's own vineyards.

2024 Bourgogne Hautes-Côtes de Nuits Blanc

2024 Moulin à Vent En Mortperay

The new generation has branched out into Beaujolais. The vines are planted on sandy granite soil. The nose shows a subtle hint of dried fruit alongside supple cherry and a touch of pepper. 2024 Bourgogne Hautes-Côtes de Nuits

The appealing 2024 Hautes-Côtes de Nuits Rouge opens with vibrant cassis and red berry aromas. The palate delivers pure forest fruit flavours with a subtle hint of sweet tobacco, all balanced by fine mineral tannins. Fully destemmed, it will be delicious on release. Drink from 2026.

2024 Chambolle-Musigny

The Chambolle opens with bright raspberry and red berry scents. On the palate, pure strawberry and rose petal notes are supported by fine, mineral tannins. A very refined and elegant Chambolle-Musigny, it will be perfect in a few years. Drink from 2027.

2024 Vosne-Romanée Les Chalandins

Close to the wall of Clos de Vougeot below Echézeaux, under Suchots, Les Chalandins has a fragrant cassis and raspberry bouquet. A fine palate reveals crushed strawberry and forest fruits balanced by supple tannins and a hint of black pepper. Drink from 2028

2024 Vosne-Romanée Aux Réas

Beautifully balanced with impressive energy, the 2024 Vosne-Romanée Aux Réas reveals an enticing bouquet of rose petals, smoke and delicate spice. Swirling red berry flavours and seamless tannin lead a long finish. Classy and elegant. Drink from 2028.

2024 Pommard 1er Cru Les Arvelets

A cooler terroir, along the river towards Saint-Romain, the 2024 has an expressive bouquet with a mixture of cassis and dark berry fruits. Juicy forest fruit on the palate are supported by rounded tannins. Shows attractive depth and length. Drink from 2028.



## Domaine A F Gros, Pommard

2024 Clos de Vougeot Grand Cru

The Clos de Vougeot has an opulent bouquet of blackcurrant and dark plum. The palate shows impressive depth, with a core of bright plum and cassis framed by elegant tannins. A fine mineral note adds definition, balancing the fresh fruit. Drink from 2029.

2024 Echezeaux Grand Cru

From Les Loächausses, just south of Echézeaux du Dessus, the 2024 offers a deep bouquet of ripe plum layered with delicate smoke and spice. The palate is intense, with vibrant red cherry fruit, silky tannins and a fine mineral backbone. Drink from 2033.

2024 Richebourg Grand Cru

The beautifully elegant Richebourg reveals a scented bouquet of cassis and rose petals. The palate is exquisitely balanced with layers of delicate, crystalline red fruit framed by seamless tannins. Harmonious and refined, with a long lingering finish, this wine will age gracefully for two decades, gaining stature and complexity. Drink from 2035.



## Domaine Antonin Guyon, Savigny-lès-Beaune

Antonin Guyon started buying vineyards in Gevrey-Chambertin and Meursault in the 1960s. A decade later, his son Dominique added 350 plots in the Hautes Côtes de Nuits. Today, Dominique and his daughter Hombeline, the fifth generation, look after a domaine covering more than fifteen different appellations. Based in Savigny-lès-Beaune, their vineyards stretch around the hill of Corton, north to Gevrey, south to Meursault, west to the Hautes Côtes de Nuits and east to Chorey-lès-Beaune. Certified organic in 2018, vinification takes place in open-top oak vats. Grapes are cold soaked before fermentation followed by a gentle post-fermentation maceration. Barrel selections are increasingly precise. The 2024 harvest started 18th September with rigorous sorting at the cellar. Continuing a recent trend, new oak was reduced. The resulting wines are charming and elegant, showing beautiful clarity and finesse.

2024 Pernand-Vergelesses 1er Cru Sous Frétille  
£220.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From a cool terroir on the steep slopes between Aloxe-Corton and Savigny-lès-Beaune, shallow soils impart an energetic mineral edge. The 2024 shows impressive persistence, with a refreshing bouquet of stone fruit and subtle white smoke. The palate combines crisp green apple and vibrant citrus flavours with a mouthwatering oyster-shell note. Drink from 2026.

2024 Meursault-Charmes 1er Cru Les Charmes Dessus  
£480.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

The 2024 Meursault Les Charmes Dessus displays an expressive floral bouquet with hints of pear and apple blossom. Elegant and beautifully balanced, the palate reveals rounded stone fruit flavours lifted by bright citrus notes and a mouthwatering finish. This appealing wine will be approachable in a few years yet promises to age for much longer. Drink from 2027.

2024 Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru

The 2024 Corton-Charlemagne reveals an enticing bouquet of white peach, flower blossom and a subtle hint of oyster shell. Beautifully balanced and refreshing, the palate combines crisp white apple and silky stone fruit, lifted by a lively mineral note and a whisper of white truffle for added complexity. Classic and delicious, it promises exceptional ageing potential. Drink from 2028.

2024 Bourgogne Hautes Côtes de Nuits Les Dames de Vergy

Les Dames de Vergy, produced under the Dominique Guyon label, comes from a vineyard in the village of Meuilley near Nuits-Saint-Georges. The bouquet reveals pure plum and redcurrant fruit aromas. A charming palate reveals sour cherry and dark strawberry fruit flavours, textured tannins and a seasoning of freshly ground pepper. Delicious from release and always terrific value. Drink from 2026.

2024 Chorey-les-Beaune Les Champs Longs

The Chorey-les-Beaune has a deep plum bouquet with notes of hedgerow fruit and violets. Broad and expressive, ripe red cherry flavours combine with silky-smooth tannins while a refreshing black pepper note adds complexity. Drink from 2027.

2024 Savigny-les-Beaune Les Goudelettes  
£162.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

A cool and exposed east facing site above the village, Goudelettes is one of the last vineyards they harvest. The 2024 has a bright bouquet of raspberries and hedgerow fruits. Crunchy strawberry, sweet plum and briary forest fruit flavours are balanced by a refreshing mineral note from the limestone soils. Really croquant! Drink from 2027.

2024 Pernand-Vergelesses 1er Cru Les Vergelesses

On the border with Savigny-Lès-Beaune, the Pernand-Vergelesses 1er Cru Les Vergelesses lies mid-slope on calcareous soils. The 2024 has a complex forest fruit bouquet with hints of black pepper. ## Domaine Antonin Guyon, Savigny-lès-Beaune

2024 Gevrey-Chambertin La Justice

From a well-drained, stony terroir that can suffer stress in dry years, the 2024 offers an enticing bouquet of sweet cassis with a hint of wet stone. Soft and appealing, the palate reveals a core of ripe cherry fruit supported by fine mineral tannins. Drink from 2027.

2024 Gevrey-Chambertin Carougeot  
£275.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

A great terroir adjacent to La Perrière Premier Cru, Carougeot is always appealing from barrel. Richer soils produce a deeper and rounder style than La Justice. Showing great complexity, sweet forest fruit aromas lead to an energetic palate with succulent cherry flavours while a chalky mineral note and a seasoning of salt add freshness. Drink from 2027.

2024 Volnay 1er Cru Clos des Chênes  
£305.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From the northern border of Volnay, touching Taillepieds, the 2024 Clos des Chênes has an enticing bouquet of plums and bright red fruit with a hint of minerality. Lifted cherry and raspberry flavours are framed by textured tannins with salty mineral finish. Clean and pure with great definition, there is lots of ageing potential here. Drink from 2028.

2024 Chambolle-Musigny Clos du Village Monopole  
£345.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

A monopole of the domaine located in the heart of the village, Clos du Village is always charming. The 2024 offers a perfumed bouquet of spicy plums. Nicely concentrated, the palate combines bright cherry flavours with silky-textured tannins and refreshing redcurrant notes. It shows plenty of energy and direction. Drink from 2028.

2024 Corton-Bressandes Grand Cru  
£485.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Below Corton Clos du Roy, Bressandes delivers impressive intensity and complexity. The 2024 opens with an inviting bouquet of fresh redcurrant and sweet plum. The palate reveals scented strawberry flavours supported by gently textured tannins. Beautifully balanced, this wine offers significant ageing potential. Drink from 2030.

2024 Corton Clos Du Roy Grand Cru

Clos du Roy lies at the heart of the southeast-facing slope of the Corton hill, just above Bressandes. This parcel of 90-year-old vines on stony soils imparts an almost ethereal character. Delicate red berry aromas lead to a refined palate of crushed raspberry and subtle rose petal, while a fine mineral note adds definition and direction. Appealing and elegant, with much more to come. Drink from 2032.



## Domaine Heresztyn-Mazzini, Gevrey-Chambertin

After a decade working on the family vineyard in Gevrey-Chambertin, Florence Heresztyn-Mazzini started her own domaine in 2012. Today, her six hectares span Gevrey-Chambertin, Morey-Saint-Denis and Chambolle-Musigny, and are distinguished by their exceptionally old vines. Florence is one of a handful of growers who follow an approach known as phytotherapy (vines are treated with natural plant remedies) which she combines with biodynamic methods to minimise interventions in the vineyard. As she explains, her role is to protect ‘the life of the terroir’ and ‘to feel, to understand, to better decide.’ Careful use of whole bunches and minimal sulphur produce deliciously pure wines. Bottling is without fining or filtration according to the lunar calendar. Apart from the Bourgogne Rouge, all wines are certified organic. Despite a small harvest, 75% down on a normal crop, Florence was delighted with the quality of the 2024s, “un très bon résultat” after a very challenging year. The wines are aromatic and pure with beautifully integrated tannins and wonderful length.

2024 Bourgogne Pinot Noir Champ Franc  
£120.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From a single parcel, Champ Franc, below Gevrey-Chambertin, the 2024 has an aromatic bouquet with scents of wild strawberries and sous-bois. The palate is lively and fresh with pretty forest fruit flavours and fine tannins. Drink from 2026.

2024 Gevrey-Chambertin Vieilles Vignes Les Jouises  
£300.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

From two plots of old vines to the south of the village, planted in the 1950s. Scented cranberry and strawberry notes lead to a pure palate with a core of sweet red fruits supported by fine, mineral tannins. 15% whole bunch. Drink from 2026.

2024 Gevrey-Chambertin Vieilles Vignes Les Songes  
£320.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Les Songes comes from En Songe and Les Gueulepines to the north of the village. 100-years-old vines give lovely definition. Aromatic on the nose, it has a silky textured palate with pure cassis and scented raspberry fruit notes. 30% whole bunch. Drink from 2026.

2024 Morey-Saint-Denis 1er Cru Les Millandes

Millandes lies to the north of the village, where old vines planted in 1958 and tiny berries from millerandage produce wines of striking intensity. The 2024 reveals an expansive nose of blackcurrant and blueberry. On the palate, an attractive core of sweet red fruits is supported by silky-textured tannins. 20% whole bunch. Drink from 2028.

2024 Gevrey-Chambertin 1er Cru La Perrière

Opposite Mazis-Chambertin, the vines face the morning sun but have less sunshine than vineyards further up the slope resulting in wines with ‘an excellent line’. Classically defined, ethereal strawberry aromas mingle with darker blackcurrant notes. Crystalline raspberry and cassis flavours are underscored by fine mineral tannins. Drink from 2028.

2024 Gevrey-Chambertin 1er Cru Les Champonnets

Les Champonnets lies on limestone soils in the middle of the slope. Millerandage concentrates the berries giving it a deeper character on the nose than La Perrière. An enveloping sweet cassis bouquet leads to a supple palate with seamless tannins and a refreshing finish. Fine direction and length. 30% whole bunch. Drink from 2028.

2024 Clos-Saint-Denis Grand Cru  
£1450.00 per 6 bottle case in bond .

The magnificent Clos-Saint-Denis reveals an intense, dark bouquet with hints of savoury spice and freshly ground pepper. Wonderfully pure cassis and strawberry notes define the palate, supported by fine-grained tannins. Harmonious and elegant, this wine offers beautiful terroir expression. Includes 30% whole bunch. Drink from 2030.



## Domaine Patrick Javillier, Meursault

Domaine Patrick Javillier, one of Meursault's finest growers, was established in 1990 and covers 11 hectares, 50% of which is white. Patrick blended grapes from different vineyards to create wines that are more than their individual parts, as with Meursault Les Clousots and Tête de Murger. The Les Forgets and Oligocène cuvées are some of the best value Bourgogne Blancs you can find. These days the domaine is run by Marion Javillier and her winemaker brother-in-law, Pierre-Emmanuel Lamy. Like many growers, Marion faced a challenging year requiring frequent interventions in the vineyards, with lower-lying plots suffering the most. Fortunately, the weather improved in September ripening the grapes in time for the harvest which started 14th September. The wines are in Marion's words "super bon" with lovely intensity and persistence.

2024 Bourgogne Côte d'Or Cuvée des Forgets

Forgets comes from the southern side of the Côte de Beaune, mainly on clay. The 2024 has a bright citrus bouquet and a zesty palate with mouthwatering lemon and orange peel notes. A wine that over delivers, it will be delicious from release. Drink from 2026.

2024 Bourgogne Côte d'Or Cuvée Oligocène

Showing more minerality than the Forgets, Oligocène comes from limestone soils which gives it a racier character. Vibrant lemon and lime aromas are followed by a bright citrus palate and a crisp mineral finish. Wonderful energy and great value. Drink from 2026.

## Guillaume Lafon, Meursault

Dominique Lafon is regarded as one of Burgundy's most innovative winemakers, with a reputation to match. In 2008, he began producing a small range of wines under his own label, separate from the family estate, Domaine des Comtes Lafon. Today, these wines are vinified, matured, and bottled at Château de Bligny, a custom-crush facility for artisan growers. Although officially a négociant, almost all the wines are effectively domaine bottlings, sourced from vineyards he owns or farms under long-term contracts. His son, Guillaume, is now taking the reins and vinified all the 2024s, hence the change in name to Guillaume Lafon.

**2024 Aligoté**

From 100-year-old vines, this Aligoté displays remarkable complexity and laser-sharp precision. The nose is taut and citrus-driven, while the palate offers invigorating notes of lemon and lime, beautifully balanced by refreshing acidity. **2024 Bourgogne Blanc**

## Olivier Leflaive, Puligny-Montrachet

Olivier co-managed Domaine Leflaive with his uncle Vincent through the 1980s and later with his cousin Anne-Claude in the early 1990s when he established Olivier Leflaive Frères. Initially sourcing grapes from selected growers, he has since acquired 15 hectares of prime vineyards across Puligny-Montrachet, Chassagne-Montrachet, and Meursault. Today, wine maker Solène Paniga, is making very pure and elegant wines. Barrel selections are more precise, and she is using less wood. 2024 was extremely challenging with significant losses in the vineyards despite their dedication. Reds were reduced by 80%, whites by 30%. Solène draws similarities with the cooler 2021 and 2014 vintages. While the reds are more delicate than in previous years, they offer refined elegance, and the whites “stand out for their freshness and brilliance.”

2024 Bourgogne Blanc Sétilles

Sétilles comes from 60 plots mainly in Puligny, Chassagne and Meursault with a few vines in the Hautes Côtes. Well balanced and nicely concentrated, it has a bright green apple bouquet with hints of white smoke. 2024 Saint-Romain Sous le Château

2024 Saint-Aubin 1er Cru en Remilly

2024 Bâtard-Montrachet Grand Cru, Domaine

The Bâtard-Montrachet shows beautifully. An enticing bouquet of honeysuckle, fresh lime and white truffle leads to a beautifully balanced palate with attractive green plum and subtle citrus fruit notes. Combining power and elegance, and still holding plenty in reserve, the 2024 will build in complexity over the next decade. Drink from 2033.

2024 Chevalier-Montrachet Grand Cru, Domaine

The Chevalier-Montrachet has an expansive bouquet of summer flowers, honeysuckle and white stone fruits. 2024 Montrachet Grand Cru

2024 Santenay Rouge

At the southern end of the Côte de Beaune, the Santenay comes from two plots, one with a preponderance of clay, the other limestone. Fragrant and appealing, the 2024 has a dark strawberry and forest fruit bouquet with a hint of spice. Crunchy red plum flavours are balanced by refreshing tannins. Great balance. Drink from 2026.



## Benjamin Leroux, Beaune

Benjamin Leroux first made his name at Domaine du Comte Armand, where he served as general manager until 2014. He launched his own label in 2007 and now produces wines from over 50 vineyards. In addition to seven hectares owned by the domaine, he sources grapes from trusted organic and biodynamic growers. All wines are vinified in the same way, with no distinction on the label between estate-grown and purchased fruit. In 2024, Benjamin reported a decent crop of whites but significant losses for the reds - down 30% in the Côte de Beaune and as much as 80% in the Côte de Nuits. A rigorous selection was carried out in the vineyards. The 2024 reds were mostly destemmed, as Benjamin judged the stems insufficiently ripe.

2024 Saint-Romain Sous le Château

From a cool limestone terroir, one of the best in Saint-Romain, the 2024 has a delicate floral bouquet with hints of honeysuckle. The palate offers fine depth, with sweet lemon and a touch of orange peel balanced by a crisp mineral edge. Drink from 2026.

A charming Meursault from five plots across the appellation, including Blagny, the 2024 shows an appealing apple-scented bouquet with touches of yellow fruit. The palate is attractive and rounded, with stone fruit notes and a fine balance. Drink from 2026.

## Domaine Sébastien Magnien, Meursault

A young domaine in name only, as it descends from Domaine Parigot de Meloisey in the Hautes Côtes de Beaune, Sébastien Magnien transferred to renovated cellars in Meursault in 2003. Today the property extends over 12 hectares and follows sustainable principles. The whites come from the Hautes Côtes, Saint-Romain and Meursault, and the reds from Volnay, Pommard, Beaune and the Hautes Côtes. A talented vigneron, Sébastien's style is true to the most classical Burgundian traditions. His hands-off approach in the cellar, combined with minimal sulphur and restrained oak, produces wines that are bright, focused and full of character. Picking started 16th September in 2024. This is a great vintage for Sébastien. Whites show wonderful freshness and persistence, while the reds are deliciously pure and expressive.

2024 Hautes-Côtes de Beaune Blanc

The Hautes-Côtes Blanc comes from three parcels in Meloisey. Balanced and persistent, the 2024 has a vibrant citrus bouquet with a hint of spice. Green apple and refreshing stone fruit flavours are underscored by a chalky mineral note. Shows great tension and persistence. 10% new wood. Drink from 2026.

2024 Saint-Romain Sous le Château

A classy Bourgogne Rouge from vines just below Pommard, the 2024 has a fruity plum and hedgerow bouquet. Nicely concentrated, briary redcurrant and black cherry flavours combine with supple tannins and a chalky mineral freshness. Drink from 2026.

2024 Hautes-Côtes de Beaune Vieilles

Planted by Sébastien's grandparents around the village of Meloisey on limestone soils, the Hautes-Côtes de Beaune Rouge has a lifted redcurrant and raspberry bouquet with a hint of damson. Showing attractive depth on the palate, sweet cassis notes and crushed cranberry flavours are balanced by fine tannins. Excellent. Drink from 2026.

2024 Pommard Les Perrières

Les Perrières lies beneath the Premier Cru Les Petits Epenots, towards Beaune. This medium to full-bodied Pommard offers an enticing bouquet of blackberry fruit, dried herbs and a subtle hint of candied orange peel. Sour cherry and briary forest fruit flavours are supported by textured tannins. It shows impressive energy and structure, promising excellent ageing potential for ten years or more. Drink from 2027.



## Domaine Michel Noëllat, Vosne-Romanée

Sixth generation winemakers at the domaine, cousins Sébastien Noëllat and Sophie Noëllat-Sirugue are establishing a significant reputation. Sophie is married to Arnaud Sirugue from around the corner, and Ghislaine Barthod is their cousin, so there is plenty of pedigree here. The estate is in Vosne-Romanée, next to Domaine Leroy, and covers 27 hectares of mainly old vines. Their top wine is Clos de Vougeot followed by Echezeaux. Premier Crus include Vosne Romanée 1er Cru Les Suchots and Nuits-Saint-Georges 1er Cru Aux Boudots. Wine making is traditional, and grapes are 100% destemmed, though less oak and lighter toasts are being used in favour of older and larger demi-muids from selected coopers lending the wines an increasingly refined character.

2024 Chambolle-Musigny

Produced from four plots of 80-year-old vines, this Chambolle-Musigny offers an enticing bouquet of dark forest fruits layered with delicate spice. The palate is refined and silky, supported by fine-grained tannins and vibrant freshness. Drink from 2026.

2024 Nuits-Saint-Georges 1er Cru A Les Boudots  
£635.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Neighbouring Vosne-Romanée, with Malconsorts just across the road, the Aux Boudots delivers wonderful intensity. A perfumed bouquet of dark plum and hints of spice, is followed by a palate layered with dark fruits. Impressive depth. Drink from 2028.

2024 Vosne-Romanée 1er Cru Les Suchots

## Domaine Paul Pillot, Chassagne-Montrachet

Thierry Pillot, the fourth generation at this legendary estate founded in 1900, oversees 13 hectares of vineyards, primarily in Chassagne-Montrachet, with additional holdings in Saint-Aubin and Santenay. Alongside the domaine wines, Thierry produces several cuvées from purchased fruit under his own label. Widely regarded as one of Burgundy's most exciting growers, Thierry crafts wines with incredible tension and energy achieved by picking early, minimising oxidation and avoiding new wood. Organic methods are followed in the vineyards resulting in 17 treatments in 2024. Harvest began on September 14th, yielding perfectly ripened grapes that produced wines of exceptional purity, precision and vibrancy.

Arnaud, who worked alongside his father and aunt for many years, is an exceptionally skilled and experienced vigneron. Highly regarded plots include Grands Echézeaux Grand Cru, Vosne-Romanée 1er Cru Les Petits Monts, Chambolle-Musigny Les Mombies and Vosne-Romanée Les Barreaux. The 2024 vintage was vinified in Arnaud's impressive new winery in Vosne-Romanée. New equipment including gravity-flow systems has contributed to the purity and elegance of these wines. 2024 is a brilliant vintage for this dynamic and fast-rising domaine.

2024 Bourgogne Côte-d'Or Pinot Noir

From parcels in Vosne-Romanée, Flagey-Echézeaux and Chambolle-Musigny, the 2024 has an enticing bouquet of redcurrants and delicate strawberry fruits. Silky red berry and rose petal flavours are balanced by very fine tannins. Delicious. Drink from 2026.

2024 Vosne-Romanée L'Harmonie

L'Harmonie (formally Les Quatres Terroirs) is a blend of 4 parcels: Aux Réas to the south adds delicacy, Les Chalandins to the north provides muscular depth, Les Barreaux at the top of the slope gives freshness while Les Communes near the bottom contributes elegance. The 2024 is refined and silky textured with wonderful length. Drink from 2027.

2024 Chambolle-Musigny Les Mombies

Les Barreaux is one of the first wines Arnaud and Sophie made together. It offers lovely depth and intensity and a fine mineral note. ## Domaine Tollot-Beaut, Chorey-lès-Beaune

Established in 1880, Domaine Tollot-Beaut was among the first producers in the Côte d'Or to start bottling wines at the domaine in 1921. Now in the hands of the fifth generation, Nathalie Tollot and her two cousins, Olivier and Jean-Paul, this historic property covers 24 hectares in Chorey-lès-Beaune, Savigny-lès-Beaune, Beaune and Aloxe-Corton. Old vines and low yields give the wines remarkable intensity. "We don't think stems are fruit" says Nathalie, so all the bunches are fully destemmed using a new machine that removes individual berries without breaking their skins. Oak has been reduced, the village and regional wines receiving about 20% new oak and the Grand Crus between 50% and 60%. Harvest began on 16th September in 2024 and quality is excellent. The wines show wonderful purity and definition, "our kind of vintage" remarks Nathalie.

2024 Bourgogne Côte d'Or Blanc

An attractive floral bouquet with scents of peach, white flowers and fresh almonds. The palate is rounded with lovely yellow fruits and a salty mineral finish. Drink from 2026.

2024 Bourgogne Côte d'Or Rouge

## Domaine Hubert Lignier, Morey-Saint-Denis

Laurent Lignier and his father Hubert produce extraordinarily classic and pure wines. They manage nine hectares of vineyards, mainly in Morey-Saint-Denis and Gevrey-Chambertin and follow organic methods (the domaine has been certified organic since 2019). A low intervention approach in the cellar involves minimal use of new oak, long barrel ageing between 20–22 months and bottling by gravity without fining to keep as much character as possible in the wines. The resulting style is one of elegance and purity with great ageing potential. A cool cellar slows maturation, which is one of the reasons why Laurent releases his wines a year later than most growers. Except for the Saint-Romain Blanc and Bourgogne Rouge which are 2024, the current release is 2023.

2024 Saint-Romain Blanc La Combe Bazin

2023 Morey-Saint-Denis Trilogie

£135.00 per 1 magnum case in bond

From three old vine parcels planted between 1936 and 1972, on the edge of the Premier Crus, the grapes suffer from millerandage concentrating the flavours. Showing an attractive floral bouquet, the well-defined palate has refreshing cassis and dark cherry notes, a fine structure and a mineral finish. Great ageing potential. Drink from 2027.



## Domaine Hubert Lignier, Morey-Saint-Denis

2023 Pommard Les Chanlins

A vineyard acquired in 2009 south of the village bordering Volnay, Chanlins is located mid-way up the slope where the soils thin out. The wines are elegant and mineral with delicate fruits notes and pronounced but well-integrated tannins. Drink from 2027.

2023 Gevrey-Chambertin Les Seuvrées

Located just below Mazoyères-Chambertin, old vines planted between 1938 and 1966, and stony soils from the combe above, lend a certain finesse to this wine. 2023 Chambolle-Musigny Vieilles Vignes

2023 Charmes-Chambertin Grand Cru

From Mazoyères Haut, planted in 1948, the Charmes-Chambertin has a well-defined and focused bouquet with sweet cassis and wild strawberry scents. ## Domaine Joseph Roty, Gevrey-Chambertin

Domaine Joseph Roty has remained in the same family for twelve generations, since 1710. "We keep faith with real Burgundy!" says Pierre-Jean who now runs the domaine. Old vines and traditional ways of working create wines of remarkable character and depth. All bunches are fully destemmed, and bottling is without fining or filtration following lunar phases. These wines develop the most wonderful aromas and complexity with age. Pierre-Jean has been experimenting with different barrels over the last few vintages adding complexity and finesse. As with Lignier, he releases a year later than most growers. The harvest started 12th September in 2023. The wines are outstanding, offering superb depth and vibrant energy.

2023 Marsannay Champs Saint-Etienne

An excellent south-east facing terroir in the heart of Marsannay, mid-way up the slope, this would be a monopoly but for a few vines owned by another vigneron. The 2023 has a rich bouquet with plummy red fruit notes. On the palate, crunchy cassis flavours combine with fine tannins. Shows great depth and energy. Drink from 2027.

2023 Marsannay En Ouzelois  
£195.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

An unusual name that may have meant a field of birds, En Ouzelois comes from 100-year-old vines planted on well drained soils at the opening of a stream. More complex than Champs Saint-Etienne, a dark strawberry and sweet plum nose leads to a smooth textured palate with a refreshing finish. Shows great purity. Drink from 2028.

2023 Côte de Nuits-Villages La Croix Violette  
£200.00 per 6 bottle case in bond

Croix Violette is in the village of Brochon north of Gevrey-Chambertin. The 2023 has a perfumed bouquet of strawberries and violets. The medium bodied palate displays refreshing cassis fruit and supple tannins. Fresh and attractive with lovely length, it offers fantastic value. From the 2025 vintage it will become a Fixin. Drink from 2028.

## Domaine Joseph Roty, Gevrey-Chambertin

2023 Gevrey-Chambertin

From five parcels, the 2023 has a scented redcurrant and cherry bouquet. On the palate, sweet plum and wild berries combine with fine tannins. A classically defined Gevrey-Chambertin it has a silky texture and plenty of ageing potential. Drink from 2027.

Drink from 2032.

2023 Mazy-Chambertin Grand Cru
